ICM believes that GS CleanTech’s alleged patent claims will be proved to be invalid. In the Kansas litigation, we have asserted that GS CleanTech/GreenShift misrepresented the liability of ICM’s customers for operating the ICM system, and that various actions of GS CleanTech/GreenShift constitute unfair competition and wrongful interference with ICM’s existing and prospective business and contractual relationships. Our customers continue to operate their oil recovery systems acquired from ICM, and we continue to see strong interest from prospective customers for further orders for ICM’s equipment,” said Chris Mitchell, ICM Vice President of Marketing.

Jeff Painter, Cardinal Ethanol, LLC’s President and CEO stated, “ICM will be defending Cardinal in the Indiana litigation; because the litigation involves our operation of ICM equipment, we are directing all further inquiries to ICM. In the interim period, Cardinal expects to continue to operate its oil recovery system.”
